Firstly, let me apologies to you, on behalf of the ALASA Board, for our unresponsiveness to your anxieties in relation to the hosting of the 2020 ALASA conference. It is now apparent that the unprecedented COVID 19 dictates our lives, and it appears that no one knows what the future holds. Hence our response to you at this point in time.

Secondly, I have been in consultation with the ALASA Board, Chair of the Organising Committee (Prof Satyo) as well as the Management of the Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities, at Fort Hare, (Dean Nekhwevha) regarding the postponement of our conference in the light of the pandemic. The general feeling is that we should move the conference to 2021 (Term 1, date to be announced at a later stage).
